REPORTS:

1. Treasurer's Report:

We have \$17,000 in our Treasury. Even after paying bills, we will be able to proceed

with the projected costs of both the Continuing Ed Program and the Journal Publication in the upcoming year, with several thousand still left in the Treasury.

2. Nominations Committee:

Our thanks to Ruth Jaffe, Lillian Kagan, and Susan Mulliken for their work on this committee.

All four amendments passed: (a) Three out of nine Board positions will be for new Members of the Board at each election; (b) Officers and Board Members may hold only two consecutive (two-year) terms; (c) Past-Presidents have voting privileges only for their term as Past-President and then are no longer members of the Board; (d) The Society has a new name: **The Psychoanalytic Society of the Postdoctoral Program.**

3. Continuing Education Committee:

4. In-House Meeting Committee:

Ruth Jaffe's evening in-house presentation, "Crises in the Life of the Analyst," was oversubscribed, with 23 people signing up. It was suggested that we produce more in-house seminars with Society Members presenting in the upcoming year as so many people signed up for Ruth's presentation. Our thanks to Ruth for a worthwhile evening and for stimulating a potentially new and interesting direction for the Society's development.

5. Referral Service Report:

The Referral Service is averaging four to five successful referrals per month, which is an average of one referral per Referral Service member per year. They need more referrals and there was some discussion as to how to obtain them.

6. Publication Committee:

The Society's long-planned Journal Publication will be published some time next year. It will contain a number of excellent articles from graduates, matriculants, and faculty of the Postdoctoral Program.

7. 5th Biennial Conference of the Psychoanalytic Society, Winter 1990:

Members of the Society can start thinking now about whether you would like to chair

this conference. The committee will be reconstituted in the Fall of this year. Contact Helen Silverman or Susan Warshaw if you are interested.
