



Freud led the way in understanding the profound part that sexuality plays in human life, especially in the early development of identity and its later unfolding. In our own day sexual issues continue to beckon scientists of all persuasions, for within its province seems to lie the deepest secrets of our being. Recent studies of differences in sexual experience and early gender role orientation promise to shed new light on who we are and how we behave throughout the life span, and to integrate our understanding of the complex interplay between biological, psychological, and social forces. Sexuality is relevant to any discussion of fact and fantasy in uncovering the basic mechanisms of the unconscious and the self, a discussion which once again has become highly charged within our field. In intimate and family relationships, as well as in the wider social network of our society, sexuality needs to be addressed from a contemporary psychoanalytic and therapeutic stance, enabling all mental health practitioners, regardless of theoretical bent, to communicate with each other. This conference on sexuality is offered in the spirit of exploration and open inquiry, in the hope of relating our psychoanalytic knowledge to current issues.
